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# FROM THE LEADERSHIP TEAM

# President's Message

This is my third and final year as President of the Pharmaceutical Society of Singapore. As I reflect on the past year, I am immensely proud of the achievements and progress made by PSS. This can only be possible through the strong support and contribution of all our volunteer members.

An important milestone occurred on 28 October 2024 whereby trained community pharmacists are now able to provide influenza vaccinations at selected retail pharmacies under a sandbox by the Ministry of Health (MOH) Singapore. This is made possible through a proposal made by PSS to MOH. Over the past few years, the team of dedicated community chapter pharmacists worked closely with MOH, Chief Pharmacist's Office and the Health Sciences Authority. Within 2 months of its launch, over 400 influenza vaccinations had been administered! Hence I am confident that community pharmacists can play a more active role and through collaboration with general practitioners and fellow healthcare professionals, make a difference in preventive health and in Healthier SG.

Similarly, as part of our community engagement and outreach, I am pleased to inform that we celebrated our inaugural collaboration with the National University of Singapore (NUS) Health T.A.G (Test, Advise, Go!) team for our annual Pharmacy Week Health Carnival, held at Heartbeat@Bedok on 29 September 2024. Through this collaboration, participants were able to receive free personalised health assessments (including tests for BP, glucose, lipids and urine proteins) whilst at-risk individuals were followed up by our collaborators post event.

One of PSS's strategic priorities is to represent and be the voice for the pharmacy profession. Hence I am happy to announce that we launched our first position paper "The Cardiology Pharmacy Practice in Singapore: Looking into the Future" at the 33rd Singapore Pharmacy Congress opening ceremony. This paper is endorsed by the Singapore Cardiac Society and the Chapter of Cardiologists - Academy of Medicine, Singapore. It highlights the current identified gaps, proposes possible strategic thrusts and make recommendations on how to strengthen the cardiology pharmacy workforce in collaboration with cardiologists and cardiology advanced practice nurses over the next 5 to 10 years. This marks the first of a series of position papers planned by PSS, including one on the response to Healthier SG.

# President's Message

On the professional development front, we strongly believe that pharmacists need to constantly upgrade themselves – both in knowledge and skills. The past year was spent in re-organizing the Professional Education Chapter and to build up a Training Academy, to serve the varied needs of the profession. We hope to fill the key positions of the various portfolios with a team of committed and capable pharmacists, willing to contribute to PSS and the profession. Nonetheless, we have commenced on a few initiatives to upskill our community pharmacists and to assist with the funding of these courses. Firstly, we've formed a Dermatology Practice Task Force consisting of representatives from both hospital and community pharmacies. The taskforce has commenced on the curation of a dermatology practice program for community pharmacists. We are also excited that the Dermatological Society of Singapore is open to collaborating with PSS on this meaningful initiative. Furthermore, the Community Chapter has curated a smoking cessation programme specially tailored for our community pharmacists and we hope to be able to launch this by 2025.

Contributing to the innovation space, PSS successfully organised our very first hackathon termed SGHackItRx – Ageing Well: Innovation for Super-Aged Societies in conjunction with the Singapore Pharmacy Congress. This event brought together pharmacists, entrepreneurs, engineers, designers, data and AI scientists to work on how to co-create solutions for healthcare challenges. This hackathon was made possible with the support of our programme and event partners. Through collaboration, we were able to leverage on each other's strengths to deliver a successful hackathon.

On 18 January 2025, the 118th Council gathered with invited members to discuss strategies on how to ADVANCE PSS. We agreed on 3 main themes ie to be a society for the pharmacy community, to be the go-to partner to other healthcare professionals and general public and to strengthen the branding of PSS. This was followed by another engagement session with Chairpersons of our various chapters and committees on 19 February. This marks the strong resolve of the Council for our focus from 2025 and beyond.

Last but not least, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to all PSS volunteers who had been generous in offering their invaluable time to serve on our various committees and those who represent PSS in external workgroups. I am also immensely grateful to PSS mentors, past PSS Presidents and PSS Fellows for always being there and offering support and invaluable advice.

It is now time for me to hand over the leadership to the next Council. I trust that they will continue to live up to the motto "Not for self, but for all" and possess unwavering commitment to elevate the pharmacy profession to greater heights.

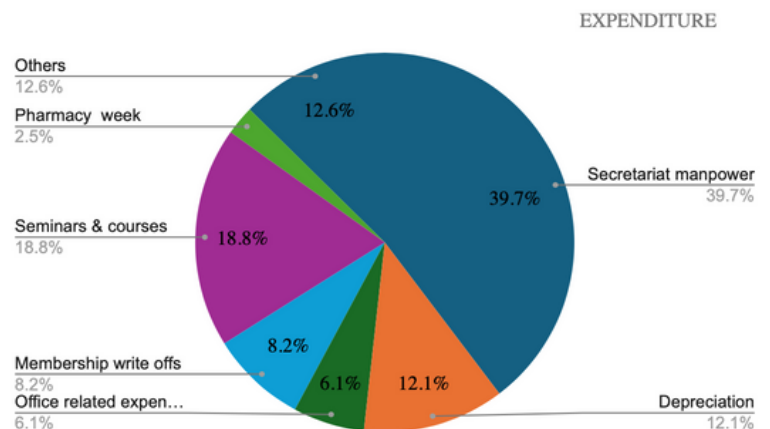
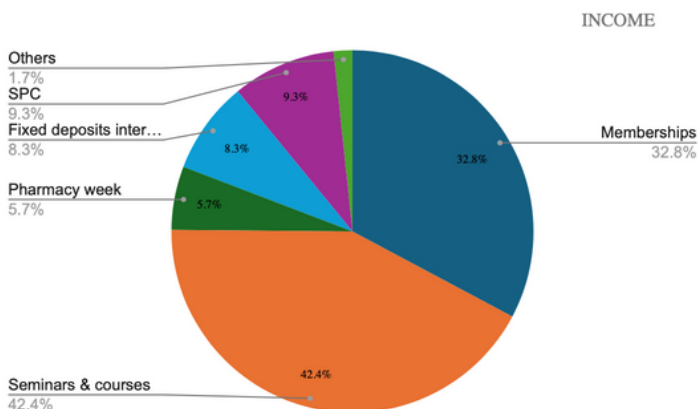
# Treasurer's Message

2024 marks an exciting new chapter for PSS with our relocation to Connection One! We have made a significant investment in renovations, anticipating this location will serve as our long-term home.

Our primary revenue streams continue to be membership subscriptions and educational offerings (seminars and courses). While we experienced a 27% decrease in overall income compared to 2023, we also managed to reduce our expenditure by 10% during the same period. The reduction in income is primarily attributed to the number of courses we conducted, specifically conducting only one CPTC session and no HA course in 2024.



The Singapore Pharmacy Congress 2024 demonstrated excellent financial performance despite increased operational costs. Through strategic sponsorship acquisition, the team successfully generated a net profit of \$43,296—representing an impressive 115% increase from 2023 results. We extend our sincere appreciation to the SPC team for their outstanding fundraising efforts.

Our primary expenditures continue to be allocated to secretariat staffing and educational programmes (seminars and courses). During the third quarter of 2024, we experienced a transition in our administrative team, with two staff members departing. Mr. Eugene Fok admirably stepped up as the core administrative pillar for PSS during this period. I extend my deepest gratitude to Eugene for his exceptional dedication and tireless efforts on behalf of our organisation. Despite the challenges of decreased revenue and relocation expenses, I am delighted to report that PSS achieved a net profit of \$89,597 for the fiscal year.

In closing, I wish to express my sincere appreciation to the following individuals for their outstanding contributions and unwavering support throughout 2024: Dr. Vivianne Shih (President), Ms. Jennifer Choo (Accountant), the 118th PSS Council member and Mr. Eugene Fok (PSS Secretariat).

I look forward to the 119th Council building upon the strong foundation established by the 118th Council and continuing to elevate PSS to new heights of excellence!

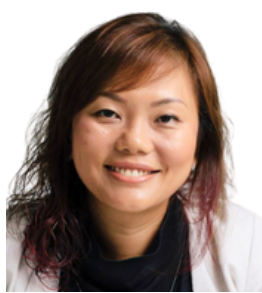

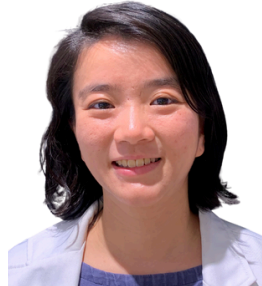

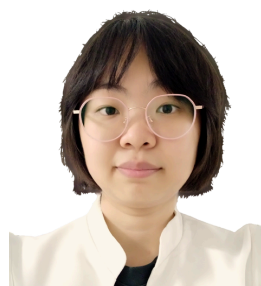

# ADVOCATING FOR OUR PATIENTS' INTERESTS

## New Initiative: Influenza vaccination services offered by community pharmacists under new sandbox initiative

28 October 2024 marks an important milestone for community pharmacy practice in Singapore. From this date, trained community pharmacists can provide influenza vaccinations at Guardian NEX, Unity Parkway Parade and Watsons Paragon under a MOH sandbox. This significant breakthrough was made possible by a dedicated team of PSS community chapter pharmacists who worked closely with the Ministry of Health (MOH), the Chief Pharmacist's Office (CPO), and the Health Sciences Authority (HSA), along with valuable advice by selected PSS Council members.

This initiative improves public access to preventive healthcare such as vaccination services, which in turn reduces the elderly's risk of falling severely ill and reduces the burden on hospitals.

This sandbox aims to get GPs and pharmacists to work in collaboration as Singapore moves towards community care.

As of December 2024, the sandbox has far exceeded its original projected goal (200 vaccinations in one year) by successfully administering over 400 vaccinations. Response from a MOH survey also indicates an overwhelmingly positive note with most patients commending on the accessibility of this service and the professionalism of the pharmacist vaccinators. As the majority of respondents also expressed an interest in going to the pharmacy for future flu vaccinations, community pharmacists look forward with optimism to playing a bigger role in providing preventive healthcare to the community.



# Pharmacy Week 2024 - Just Ask! Know Your Medicines!



PSS Pharmacy Week 2024 took place at Heartbeat@Bedok on September 29, 2024. The event attracted over 1,000 participants, including distinguished guests such as Guest-of-Honor, Senior Minister of State (SMS) Tan Kiat How, Ministry of Digital Development and Information & Ministry of National Development, and Ms Cheryl Chan, Member of Parliament representing the Fengshan division of East Coast GRC, and representatives from the various healthcare institutions.



The focus of this year's Pharmacy Week was to empower the public to take an active role in their health management by promoting medication awareness and education. A wide range of engaging booth activities were organized to educate the public about safe medication management, common chronic conditions, and common misconceptions surrounding health supplements. Informative health talks on topics like vaccination, dementia care, mental well-being, and heart and brain health further enriched the event.

PSS also collaborated with pharmacy students from NUS Health T.A.G. (Test, Advise, Go!), who provided free personalized health assessments, including tests for blood pressure, glucose, lipids, and urine proteins. In addition, pharmacists offered one-on-one consultations, helping the public with their medication queries and health management strategies. The sessions were fully booked, with over 200 members of the public turning up for the assessments. Collaborators like 1doc Medical Centre and iRx Clinical Pharmacy played a crucial role in providing follow-up assessments for at-risk individuals and administering vaccinations to those eligible.

Leading up to the main event, pre-event activities such as the “Know Your Meds Saturday” quizzes and educational posts on social media channels, including Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, and the official Pharmacy Week website, kept the public engaged and informed.

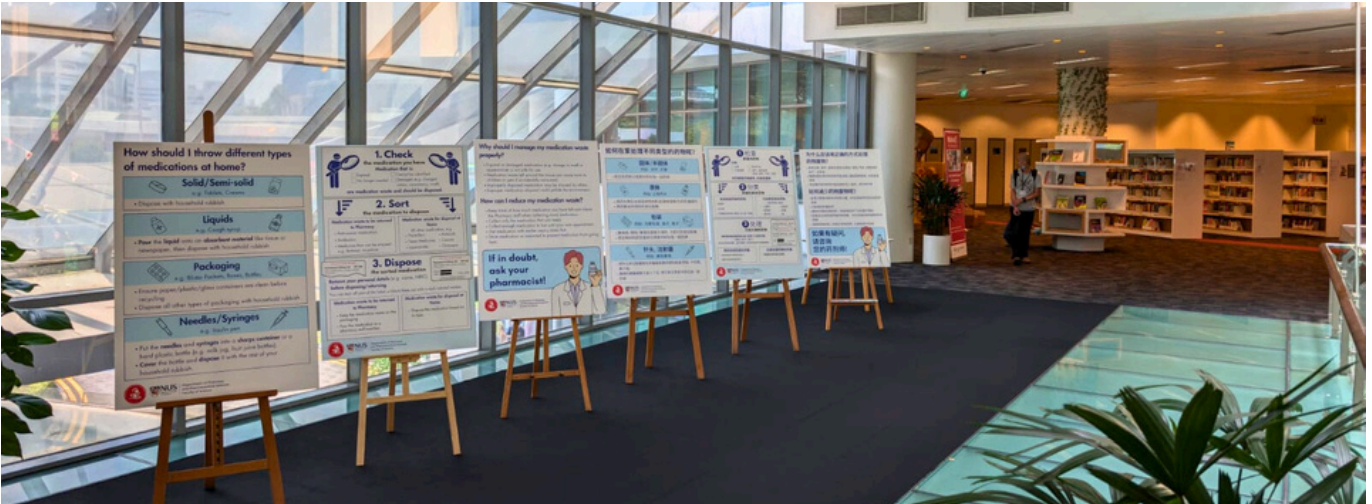

## Public Education Initiatives

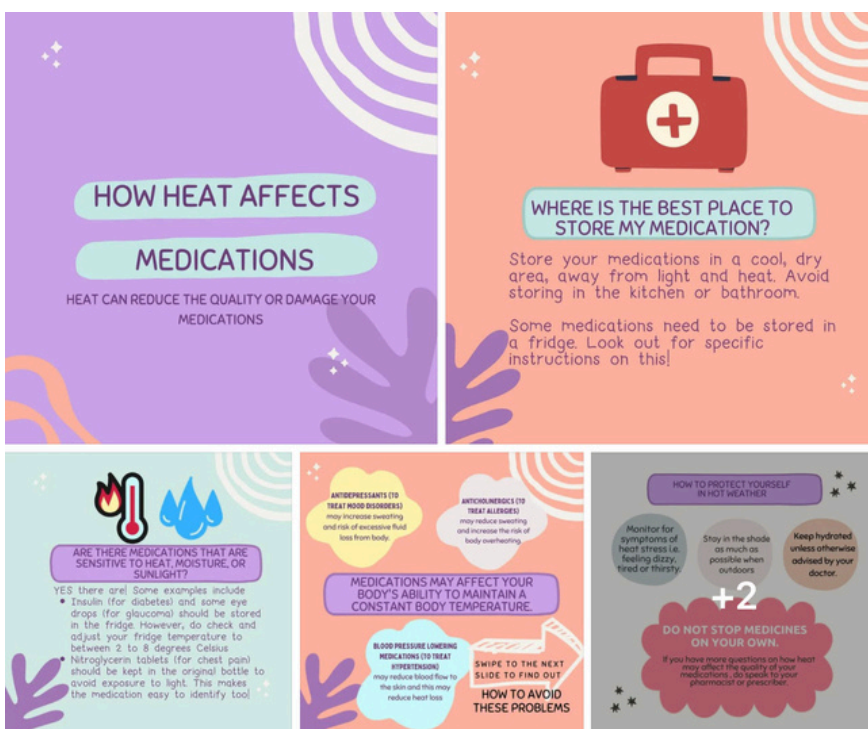


Public Education Chapter's poster campaign on display at Jurong Regional Library

## Public Education Events

We co-organized two "Know Your Meds, Get It Right" carnival events with the Essential Medicines Committee (EMed) under the National University of Singapore Pharmaceutical Society (NUSPS) and the respective Community Development Council (CDC). In addition to providing free medication review consultations, volunteer pharmacists from PSS also contributed in screening and education on prevention of osteoporosis and falls during the KYMGIR @NorthWest CDC and KYMGIR @Central CDC, held respectively at Woodlands and Bishan in March and November.

In collaboration with the National Library Board, we held a poster campaign in September at Jurong Regional Library to educate the public on proper medication waste disposal. As part of the campaign, online talks on sustainable self-care practices by pharmacists and a Microgreens Gardening Workshop (by Edible Garden City) to promote up-cycling of medication bottles were also held. The posters on proper medication disposal were developed by project students (Ms Ong Wei Kii and Mr Boey Teng Ngee) from the National University of Singapore (NUS) Department of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences with guidance from their project supervisors from the Public Education Chapter. These posters were subsequently on loan for use at other public education events organized by various other organizations.

# Bridging Communities and Pharmacists: Recap of the latest KYMGIR's Impact on Medication Management and Public Health

For the first time, "Know Your Medicines, Get It Right! (KYMGR)" was hosted in Central Singapore at the Bishan Community Club on 2 November 2024, organized by the 22nd and 23rd Essential Medicines (EMed) Committee under the NUS Pharmaceutical Society, in partnership with the Public Education Chapter of the Pharmaceutical Society of Singapore (PSS) and Central Community Development Council (CDC). KYMGIR is an annual event that serves to connect pharmacists with residents, facilitate medication reviews and provide public education on optimal health management and medication use.

In all, 12 dedicated pharmacists volunteered their Saturday to offer personalised consultations and pharmaceutical care plans for effective and safe medication use as well as optimal health management to over 170 KYMGIR participants. More than 100 student volunteers from NUS Department of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences were also activated to provide education on general medication management tips at the poster displays.

From the data collected, the pharmacists reviewed more than 200 medications. Among 84 participants screened using calculated Osteoporosis Self-Assessment Tool for Asians (OSTA) scores, about 25% were identified to have high risk for osteoporosis and advice on further assessment and workup with their primary caregiver was given for those who require it.

This KYMGIR also featured a series of talks on the theme of osteoporosis and fall prevention by Dr. Golda Wang (Principal Clinical Pharmacist at Alexandra Hospital), Ms. Chan Shi Mun (Pharmacist at Alexandra Hospital), and Ms. Jessie Chan (Senior Occupational Therapist at Pacific Rehab & Therapy). This series of talks was enriched with a Tai Chi session led by Ms. Jennifer Chung (Tai Chi for Health trainer at the People's Association), who shared about the health benefits of Tai Chi and demonstrated a routine specifically for managing osteoporosis.

In collaboration with esteemed partners such as the SG Digital Office, Health Promotion Board, Healthier SG Office, Ministry of Health Holdings, and the Silver Generation Office, the event also showcased how the respective community-based initiatives can come together to support residents in active aging and disease prevention. Through the comprehensive and enriching booths by the above partners, residents gained accessibility to personal health and medication information for self-management of medicines via HealthHub, digital health literacy and use of mobile apps like Healthy 365, awareness of frailty prevention from the functional screening booth, and assistance to enroll in the Healthier SG initiative.

# Summary of National Medication Information Workgroup Initiatives

On May 31, 2024, the National Medication Information Workgroup (NMI WG) conducted a focus group discussion with the SingHealth Patient Advocacy Network (SPAN) to gather patient perspectives aimed at improving Medication Information Leaflets (MILs) available on HealthHub. Facilitated by the Tan Tock Seng Hospital Kaizen Office, the discussion focused on refining the section related to adverse effects. Participants reviewed existing MILs and product inserts for 3 medications i.e cabozantinib (oncology) , quetiapine (psychiatry) , and hydrochlorothiazide (chronic conditions).

Key outcomes included recommendations to simplify medical terminology and to incorporate visuals that contextualize side effects. Participants expressed a preference for HealthHub MILs due to their user-friendly format but suggested enhancements like multilingual options, personalized content based on patient demographics, and the use of AI tools to improve accessibility. They also highlighted the importance of raising awareness about the availability of these resources among both patients and healthcare providers.



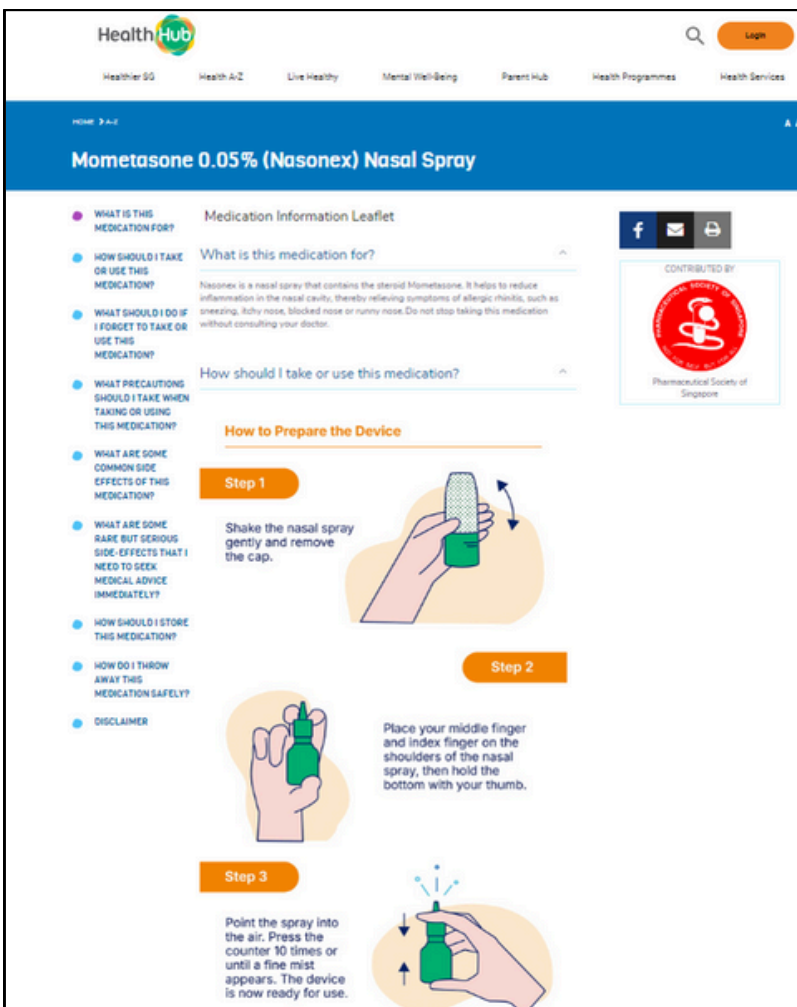
In parallel, the NMI WG developed two comprehensive sets of guidelines to standardize and enhance the MILs. The first set of the NMI Guidelines outlines editorial standards for the content and structure of MILs. The second NMI Guidelines on Health Literacy, focuses on best practices for creating patient-friendly content, ensuring that information is accessible to individuals with varying levels of health literacy. These guidelines will also serve as valuable orientation tools for new WG members.

# ADVOCATING FOR OUR PATIENTS' INTEREST

As part of HealthHub's broader revamp since late 2023, the NMI WG migrated its MILs to a new Content Management System, "Content Hub," in partnership with HealthHub. This migration, driven by HealthHub's project, will facilitate easier API integration for accessing information and streamline our workflow. This collaboration involved addressing challenges such as content mismatches through thorough reviews, ensuring that published materials are accurate and current. The ongoing partnership aims to enhance the user interface and improve overall accessibility of health information.

Additionally, the NMI WG and HealthHub have embarked on a project to optimize the content of MILs, enhancing their readability and visual appeal. This effort began with a content prioritization exercise and included incorporating images and graphics based on feedback from patient focus groups. Initial enhancements focused on MILs for vaginal pessaries and nasal sprays, with plans to extend this approach to other medications.

Overall, these initiatives reflect the NMI WG's commitment to patient-centered care, informed decision-making, and the continuous improvement of medication information accessibility.

# 33rd Singapore Pharmacy Congress (SPC) - Interlacing Health: Weaving the Future of Pharmacy



The 33rd Singapore Pharmacy Congress (SPC) was a resounding success, bringing together close to 1200 attendees (almost 50% increment compared to 2023 and participants from North American continent, European continent and even Australian continent) at the Grand Copthorne Waterfront Hotel. This year's theme, "Interlacing Health: Weaving the Future of Pharmacy," focused on the pivotal role of pharmacists in addressing healthcare challenges.

The congress featured four thematic tracks around person-centered, value-based care, with emphasis on harnessing digitalisation, automation, and Artificial Intelligence to co-create innovative healthcare solutions. SPC provided participants with the opportunity to explore interdisciplinary collaborations with healthcare professionals and industry leaders.



# DEVELOPING OUR PROFESSION

The congress received 94 abstract submissions, of which 82 were accepted, including 8 from overseas pharmacists. We were also pleased to feature oral presentations from Singapore and Hong Kong. In addition, 2 overseas participants from Australia and India competed in the poster category. These contributions highlight the congress's role as a platform for research exchange and collaboration among pharmacists in Singapore and beyond, further reinforcing its growing international reach and impact.



Key opinion leaders were invited and Professor Tracey Thornley, Professor of Health Policy, University of Nottingham was the keynote speaker. Professor Dean Ho, Provost's Chair Professor and Head of the Department of Biomedical Engineering in the College of Design and Engineering from National University of Singapore laid the ground for discussions on AI and therapeutics and drug development. The congress ended with a plenary lecture by Professor Nick Watts, Centre for Sustainable Medicine, National University of Singapore who reminded us on the importance of sustainable healthcare. The Professional Education Chapter of the Pharmaceutical Society of Singapore (PSS) had organised a number of continual education webinars to advance pharmacists' professional development and pharmacy practice across Singapore.

In 2024, the Chapter organised four impactful continuing education webinars, each attended by over 200 pharmacists. These sessions covered diverse and timely topics, including clinical pharmacy, sustainability, and community mental health, equipping pharmacists with critical knowledge to meet evolving healthcare needs.

- **February 2024:** The Chapter welcomed a renowned endocrinologist from Sengkang General Hospital, a member of the Diabetes and Ramadan International Alliance, to present on diabetes management during Ramadan. This webinar offered practical insights into fasting and medication management, empowering pharmacists to provide culturally sensitive care.
- **March 2024:** A leading oncologist from International Cancer Specialists discussed the incidence and management of breast cancer in Singapore, shedding light on emerging challenges and therapeutic approaches.
- **April 2024:** Addressing the global call for sustainability, the Chapter organized a webinar on the integration of sustainable practices into pharmacy. Experts, including the Deputy Director of the Centre for Sustainable Medicine, shared Singapore's sustainability initiatives, while industry leaders from Sanofi Consumer Healthcare and Turning Point highlighted strategies and challenges in implementing sustainable practices into pharmacy.
- **June 2024:** Supported by the College of Family Physicians, a community mental health webinar was conducted by a General Practitioner. He focused on empowering pharmacists to develop targeted interventions and optimize medication management for common mental health conditions prevalent in the community.

Moving forward, the Chapter is committed to fostering a culture of lifelong learning and collaboration, embracing innovation, and strengthening interprofessional partnerships. By equipping pharmacists with forward-looking skills and insights, it aims to ensure that the pharmacy profession remains dynamic, adaptable, and ready to address future healthcare challenges.

# Our Inaugural Hackathon: SGHackitRX

The inaugural #SGHackitRx hackathon “Ageing Well: Innovation for Super Aged Societies”, organized by the Pharmaceutical Society of Singapore (PSS) concluded successfully. This was supported by Programme Partner: Singapore University of Social Sciences (SUSS-Nunchi Marine Age Well Programme) and event partners Asia Startup Network, NUS enterprise and Quest Ventures, Alexandra Hospital, AI Singapore, SingHealth ALICE, AWS, Open Government Products, Singapore Biodesign and the Singapore Global Network.

The hackathon had an overwhelming response (total of 16 teams participating) and the finalists were given the opportunity to further develop their ideas in start-up accelerators with funding from PSS. Participants first met at the pre-event session at Antler, where Ms Junus Eu, CEO, Glorious, Dr Lim Seng Han, COO, Craft Health, Mr Russ Neu, Quest Ventures and Ms Sun Xinle, Altara, discussed on meeting the challenges of a super-aged society with moderator Mr Matt Onn. 167 participants worked over 2 days and pitched their solutions to pertinent problem statements at the semi-finals.

**RALPH**; a chatbot that provides empowering and personalised medication information and counselling, **MISSYBOT**; a personalised AI bridging care for elderly breast cancer patients, and **SimplePLAN**, an AI empowered way to engage patients in advance care planning conversations made it to the finals at the Singapore Pharmacy Congress 2024. We congratulate the MISSYBOT team for clinching the top prize; a grant of \$4000 sponsored by PSS! The first and second runner up was awarded a grant of \$3000 and \$2000 sponsored by Ageing well Nunchi Marine, Singapore University of Social Sciences, respectively.

# Cardiology Pharmacy Practice in Singapore, A Position Paper: Looking into the Future



PSS launched the groundbreaking “Cardiology Pharmacy Practice Position Paper”, written by a cross-disciplinary panel comprising Cardiologists and Cardiology Advanced Practice Nurses. As cardiovascular disease (CVD) remains a leading cause of morbidity and mortality in Singapore, this paper outlines critical recommendations to enhance pharmacy services and build a robust cardiology pharmacy workforce for the future, in tandem with burgeoning burden of CVD.

The key recommendations to address the growing needs of cardiovascular patients are listed below:

1. Redesigning Competency Pathways for Cardiology Practice Pharmacists to be trained in a shorter time frame
2. Better coordination between Acute and Primary Care in a person-centred manner
3. Increase access to Early Discharge Care
4. Implement Telehealth, Wearables and Artificial Intelligence (AI) as enablers to facilitate continuity of, and access to cardiovascular care
5. A call to prepare and step up for emerging roles, including in areas of Preventive Cardiology, Atrial Fibrillation, Palliative Care, Multimorbidity and Pharmacogenomics

The PSS Cardiology Pharmacy Practice Position Paper sets forth an open call to the evolving roles of pharmacists, especially in the modern age of multimorbidity and digital health. By planning for the implementation of these recommendations, we are confident that Singapore’s healthcare system can better address the challenges of an aging population and rising CVD burden.

This landmark initiative underscores PSS’s commitment to empowering pharmacists, advancing patient care, and fostering collaboration across the healthcare ecosystem. The Pharmaceutical Society of Singapore invites stakeholders, healthcare professionals, and policymakers to join this transformative journey, ensuring every Singaporean receives the best possible cardiovascular care.

# Updated Tele-pharmacy and Tele-pharmaceutical Care Services Guidelines

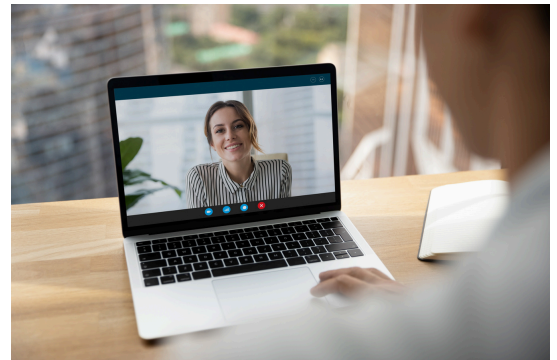
A revised version of the Guidelines for Tele-pharmacy and Tele-pharmaceutical Care Services was published at the end of July 2024, featuring some exciting changes.

With the updated revision, Tele-pharmacy services can now be provided under two scenarios:

- Situation 1: The patient calls a qualified pharmacist at a licensed pharmacy premises, with assistance from a trained staff member or pharmacy technician from another licensed pharmacy, to receive advice and medications.
- Situation 2: The patient calls directly from his or her home to a qualified pharmacist at a licensed pharmacy premises to receive advice and medications.

Additionally, trained staff are no longer required to work for 3 months to learn tele-pharmacy; they can now undergo training at any time as long as they are deemed competent.

The Guidelines for Telepharmacy and Tele-Pharmaceutical Care Services can be assessed from the PSS website.

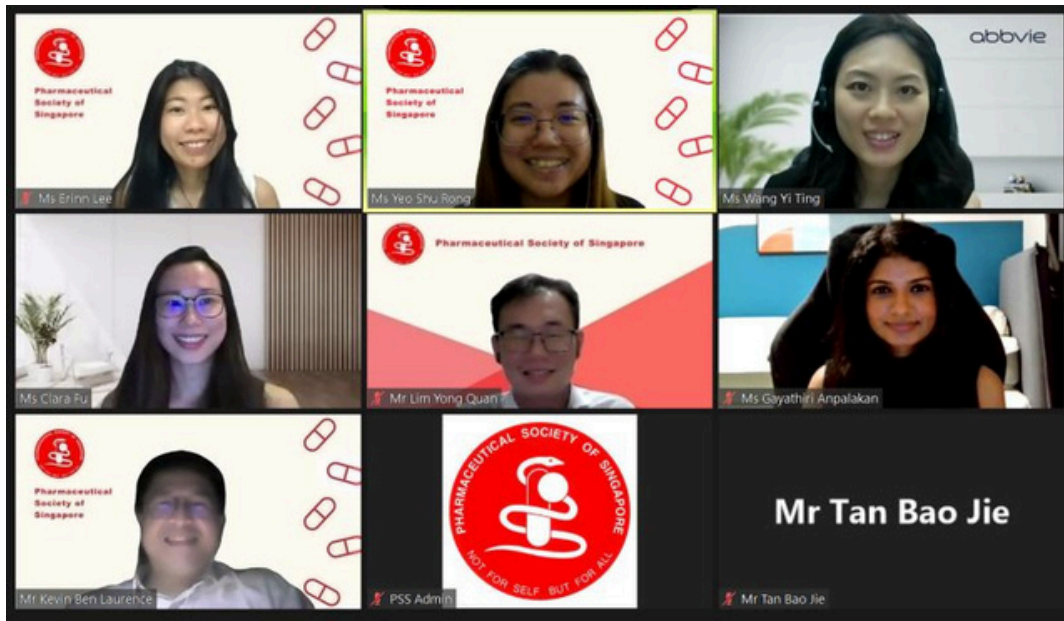

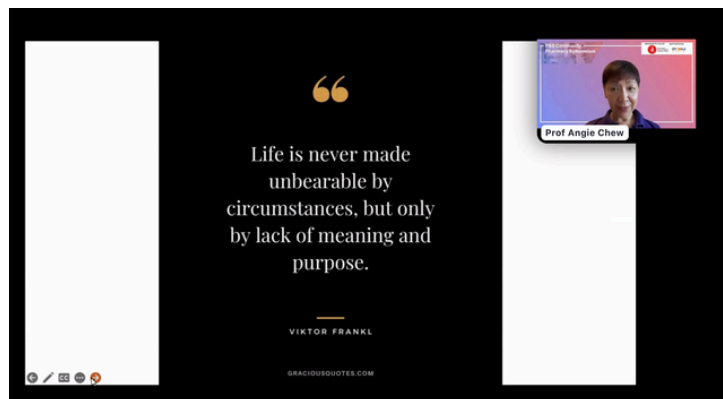

The PSS Community Chapter hosted the 4th Annual Community Pharmacy Symposium on 25 May 2024. Supported by POMConnect and DocMed Technology, this virtual event attracted 122 pharmacists from various sectors of the pharmacy community.

This year’s Symposium featured a range of engaging topics from the following speakers:

- Adj Assoc Prof Angie Chew on “How our attitude matters in defining our meaning in life” - an insightful discourse on the importance of perspective and priorities in an increasingly demanding world
- Mr Jay Chong presented on “Community pharmacy in the Digital Era – Evolving practices and Upcoming trends” and shared further on how pharmacists play a role in the emerging Tele-health landscape
- Assoc Prof Derrick Aw Chen Wee delivered an immersive sharing on some “Common skin Disease (besides acne and eczema)” which community pharmacist see every day but may be unfamiliar with

Based on the 57 responses to the feedback survey, 84.2% rated the satisfaction of this year’s symposium at least 8 out of 10, with rank 10 indicating high satisfaction. The majority of respondents (98.3%) expressed an overwhelming interest in attending the next community chapter learning event.

# PSS Practice Guide for Minor Ailments (PGMA)



PGMA is a compendium of guidelines of frequently encountered minor ailments, aiming to standardize practices across institutions and enhance the delivery of pharmaceutical care to patients in the primary sector. These modules are available on the PSS website and are complimentary for PSS members.

This year, the Community Chapter conducted a survey to assess awareness, perception and utilization of PGMA among existing and potential users of the guidelines. This survey aimed to gather valuable feedback to identify areas for improvement for future updates. Our survey indicates that while a majority of pharmacists are interested in utilising PGMA, the lack of sufficient promotion, the cost of the modules, and the text heavy appearance are barriers to its use. Future work is in progress to enhance the readability of the guides and improve pharmacists' awareness of its availability.

# PK Recharge - Upskilling for Peak Performance



This was a pre-congress workshop organized in conjunction with the SPC Congress where participants were taught fundamental pharmacokinetic (PK) concepts related to drug clearance, volume of distribution and bioavailability. A problem-based pedagogy was utilized to get participants to apply PK concepts in therapeutic drug monitoring of various drugs (including anti-infectives) guided by facilitators (which included members of the Infectious Disease Special Interest Group (IDSIG)).

Conducted at NUS Pharmacy Practice Skills Hub on 28 September 2024, 33 participants and facilitators discussed and presented case studies on drugs like phenytoin, vancomycin, voriconazole and warfarin. At the end of the session, participants were 'recharged' with the refreshed knowledge in PK concepts and were empowered to identify and solve real-world clinical pharmacy problems.

Utilizing this workshop as a testing ground, the Infectious Diseases Special Interest Group (IDSIG) hopes to organize similar workshops in the following calendar year.

An online continuing education session titled "Your DNA, Your Drugs: How Pharmacogenomics is Revolutionising Healthcare" organised by Hospital Chapter in October 2024 provided an in-depth exploration of preemptive and reactive pharmacogenomics.

The session conducted by Dr. Elaine Lo, Principal Clinical Pharmacist from National University Hospital, and Dr. Golda Wang, Principal Clinical Pharmacist from Alexandra Hospital attracted over 90 participants who were eager to delve into this innovative field.

Dr. Lo and Dr. Wang shared valuable insights from their clinical experiences and discussed the latest advancements in pharmacogenomic testing and its implications for clinical practice. They highlighted several real-world applications, including how genetic information can guide medication choices for various conditions, ultimately leading to improved patient outcomes.

The interactive nature of the Zoom session encouraged lively discussions among participants. Attendees were encouraged to consider how they could integrate pharmacogenomic principles into their practice, highlighting the importance of collaboration and continuous learning in the evolving landscape of medicine. Overall, the session was a resounding success.

# Certified Pharmacy Technician Course (CPTC)



PSS held the graduation ceremony for the 37th intake of the Certified Pharmacy Technician Course (CPTC) on the 23rd March 2024. The course, which ran from 4th July 2022 to 30th June 2023, saw 32 candidates complete the course. Via Zoom, Guest-of-Honour, Ms Janice Lim, Vice-Chairperson of the MOH Training and Development Committee (MOH TDC), congratulated the graduates and shared with them the opportunities that lie ahead as they embark on their Pharmacy Technician journey. Ms Abigail Tan, Chairperson of the Pharmacy Technician Community of Practice (PT COP), shared the activities that PT COP organises and invited the graduates to support and participate to grow the interests of PTs. Ms Angeline Hoi, one of the CPTC graduates, also shared her journey and represented the graduates to thank all who have supported them.

The 38th intake and 39th intake of CPTC saw 19 candidates and 15 candidates completed CPTC on 15th March 2024 and 30th April 2024 respectively. The 40th intake of CPTC saw 20 candidates which started the course on 4th June 2024.



# Aseptic Compounding Course

PSS organised another run of the Aseptic Compounding Course (Level 1: Good compounding practices), with support from the Lee Foundation. A total of 36 participants enrolled in this intake.

The course was delivered through e-learning, supplemented by online assessments over a span of 3 months. Following this, participants are required to attend a 1.5-hour online facilitated discussion in December 2024. This session provided an opportunity for participants to clarify course topics and share insights on aseptic compounding practices. The discussion was led by trainers Ng Cheng Li and Ng Kwee Haan.

Topics covered included engineering controls for sterile compounding, personnel and facility sampling metrics, sanitation of controlled environments, aseptic technique and requirements for handling hazardous drug compounding.



# Pre-Registration Pharmacists' Training Program



The opening ceremony was held virtually on 29th June 2024. We had welcome speeches by Dr. Vivianne Shih, President of PSS and Dr. Camilla Wong, Chief Pharmacist of Ministry of Health (MOH) to inspire our young pre-registration pharmacists as they embarked on their journey towards obtaining their license.

To equip our pre-registration pharmacists with the necessary knowledge, a series of 11 lectures were organized over 6 months. These lectures covered a comprehensive range of topics including wound care, contraception, infectious diseases and palliative & supportive care.

Closing ceremony was held at the auditorium of Sengkang Hospital on 4 January 2025. The keynote address was given by A/Prof Lita Chew, President of the Singapore Pharmacy Council (SPC), where she shared her wisdom in overcoming potential challenges the newly minted pharmacists may face as they grow and develop in their profession. Mr. Lim Cheong Cheng, a senior pharmacist from SKH was invited to share on his experience on how he transitioned from a pre-registration to a full fledged pharmacist. Mr. Ian Tan Sheng Feng and Mr Ray Lew, Chairpersons of Young Pharmacists and Membership Chapters also shared about the benefits of joining PSS. Mr Richmond Ng, Manager of Singapore Pharmacy Council also briefed all the graduating pre-registration pharmacists on the continuing professional education requirements and process of submitting such claims.

A huge thank you to all the facilitators who have assisted in making this training programme a success. Kudos to all preceptors for dedicating their time and energy in nurturing our young pre-registration pharmacists!

The Congress, themed "Next Generation Pharmacists in Asia," focused on the evolving pharmaceutical and healthcare landscape, including topics like digital health, artificial intelligence, and precision medicine. It offered valuable opportunities for knowledge exchange, allowing participants to learn about various pharmacy practices and educational developments across Asia while sharing Singapore's experiences.

During the Asian Young Pharmacist Group (AYPG) Business Meeting on November 1, Ying Ting's participation strengthened the PSS Young Pharmacists Chapter's (PSS-YPC) ties within AYPG, marking the first physical representation in five years. Delegates from 11 other member countries discussed annual reports and the upcoming Executive Committee elections for the 2024-2026 term.

At the AYPG Night hosted by the Korean Young Pharmacist Group, Ying Ting was welcomed as a new member of the AYPG Council, following her succession as Vice-Chairperson of PSS-YPC for the upcoming term. She presented PSS-YPC's projects and engaged in discussions about future representation and potential collaborations, reinforcing the chapter's commitment to regional and international pharmacist engagement.



# Green Pharma and Our Green Movement



SG Green Pharma is a ground up interest group formed by 3 pharmacists (Ms Deborah Chia, Ms Anne Neo and Ms Loh Chee Pheng) that comprises pharmacy staff across institutions who are passionate about improving sustainability in healthcare.

In May 2024, a mural painting event at Tanglin Community Club (CC) was organised in collaboration with SG Green Pharma and Our Green MoCa (Moulmein-Cairnhill). This initiative aimed to promote community engagement and environmental sustainability through the creative use of healthcare waste materials. The mural was officially launched during the Tanglin CC's jubilee carnival, with a plaque made from recycled plastic installed next to the mural to commemorate the occasion.

Participants, including PSS members, their families, and children of all ages, gathered to contribute their artistic talents, transforming the community space into a colorful canvas. The event was particularly heartwarming as it brought together individuals from different generations, fostering a sense of unity and shared purpose.

A unique aspect of this mural project was the incorporation of upcycled materials, such as medication bottles, which were creatively repurposed to contain the paint. This activity not only encouraged recycling but also showcased the community's commitment to environmental stewardship and promoting sustainability and creativity.



# NUS Pharmaceutical Society (NUSPS) YPCConnect 2024



Young Pharmacist Connect (YPCConnect) is an initiative by PSS YPC to serve as a bridge between PSS and NUS Pharmaceutical Society (NUSPS), focusing on fostering a strong cooperative relationship by engaging pharmacy students with experienced professionals through various events and activities.

In 2024, this program successfully paired 17 pharmacists with 36 pharmacy students, forming small befriending groups of 2 to 3 students per pharmacist. These befriending pairings facilitated meaningful conversations, offering students first hand insights into the practical world of pharmacy.

The program extended beyond individual meetups among pharmacist and student befrienders, featuring two large-scale group events on 2 March and 8 June 2024. # Pharmacy Technicians Training and Development Committee (Pharm Tech TDC), Ministry of Health

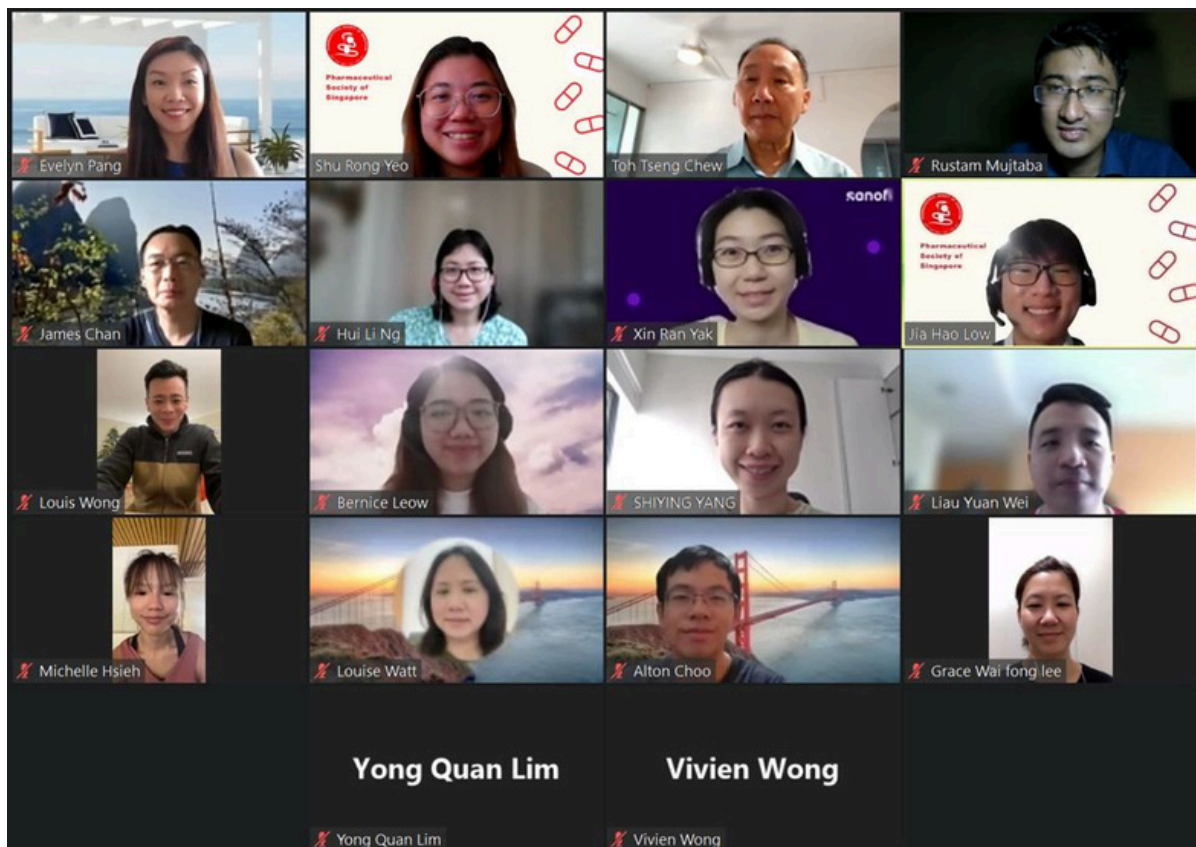

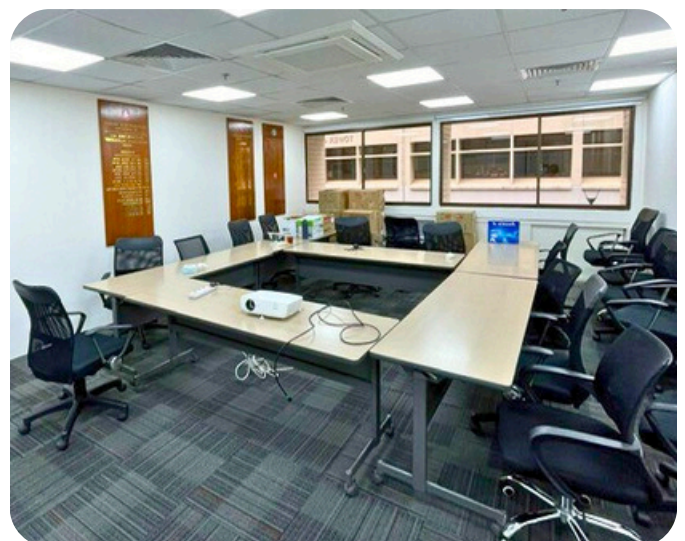
